We hope you have had a restful and enjoyable Easter break.

The summer term for Year 6 is a busy one with National Curriculum tests (SATs), our residential trip, end of term musical and secondary transfer. We will do our best as a team to ensure that all pupils feel prepared and relaxed for the busy weeks ahead.

As always, high standards are expected in all areas, as we continue to embrace and embed our school values of respect, responsibility and friendship. We want every child to develop and maintain high self-esteem. School uniform is an important aspect of gaining this sense of pride and we do ask parents to ensure that all pupils are correctly dressed and equipped for school.

#### National Curriculum tests (SATs)

The National Curriculum tests begin on Monday 11 May and continue throughout that week. It is extremely important that your child is present for the tests. Children will be tested in both English and Maths. For preparation lessons and examinations, it is vital that your child has the following equipment:

- **two HB pencils**
- **handwriting pen**
- **30cm ruler**
- **protractor**
- **eraser**
- **pencil sharpener**
- **clear pencil case/plastic wallet for storage of these**

Please check carefully with your child that they have all these items. If you are available during the week beginning Monday 11 May to help administer the tests, please read the attached reply slip and return to school as soon as possible. It is a busy time for the Year 6 team and any help is greatly appreciated.

Every morning during the National Curriculum tests week, there will be a free breakfast club from 8.30–8.55am. This is a fantastic way for your child to relax with friends before the tests. They can come along each morning for toast, fruit and juice. The breakfast club is held in the dining room and pupils must enter through the dining room doors.

#### Summer Term Topics

This term we will be completing our work on how artists see the world before moving on to a new topic, 'Early Islamic Civilisation'. Following that, we will move on to our final topic, 'Champions for Change' in which pupils will develop a fundraising event for a chosen charity.

In History, we'll be finding out:

- about characteristics of past non-European societies



- how to understand historical concepts such as continuity and change
- about achievements of past societies which have influenced modern life
- about the origins of democracy

In Citizenship, we'll be finding out:

- about systems of government in England and the rest of the world
- what makes a good leader
- how to write a persuasive political speech
- about global issues that should concern governments around the world

In Art, we'll be finding out:

- how Impressionists saw the world
- the life and work of Van Gogh and Seurat
- why Japanese printed art was so special
- how Abstract art developed
- about styles of Islamic art

In Technology, we'll be finding out:

- how to create our own party logos
- how to design and make an effective campaign poster

We'll also be finding out:

- how artists can raise awareness of global issues
- how to express our own impression of the world around us
- which global issues concern us personally and what we could do to help

Children will be reading, researching, writing, illustrating, working on their own and working in groups. We will be checking to see how well your child has learned through particular activities and asking children to explain their work, perhaps to you.

We already know the interest you take in your child's work. If you can, please discuss with your child the work they have done as the term progresses and let them teach you.

If your child has some work to research, please help them, but without actually doing the work. If you have the chance to further their interest in the ideas of these themes, please take it.

By the end of the unit, we hope your child has achieved all of the learning targets. We hope they have had an enjoyable time in the classroom and we hope you have enjoyed seeing your child work with enthusiasm. If you have any comments about the work your child has done, please get in touch.

We look forward to Sports Day on Wednesday 8 July (Thursday 9 July reserve day).

You will receive your child's annual report in July and it will be followed by an opportunity to discuss the report with the class teacher.
