Dear parents/carers

Measles, chicken pox, shingles or any suspicious spots/rash

We are asking for your co-operation in an important matter.

One of our pupils is receiving medical treatment for a very serious, but non-contagious illness which puts them at significant risk if they are exposed to measles, chicken pox or shingles.

You must let us know immediately if your child is suspected of having measles or has any suspicious spots/rash.

Our pupil is also at risk from chicken pox and may need to be given an injection within three days of contact. If your child is suspected of having chicken pox, you must let us know immediately.

It is also very important that you let us know if there is shingles in your household.

Your child is not at any risk whatsoever from this situation. However, the health and well-being of our pupil who is at risk, does depend on the co-operation of all other parents/carers: we are confident that you can help us.
