The competition theme is 'The Sky at Night.' Entrants are asked to create a piece of A4 artwork in any medium, providing it is original artwork. Each entry should be clearly marked on the reverse side with the entrant's name, age, school year and school. Ideas for artwork might be generated by encouraging children to think about the night sky: How many stars can you see? Can you identify and draw any constellations? What type of moon is it (harvest, crescent, super or full)? What shape is the moon? How bright is it? What does light pollution look like and how does it affect us and how does it affect wildlife? Consider using words and phrases to illustrate what you see and feel. Use your imagination to design a new constellation and name it. All entries must be given to Mrs Bruguier by Friday 4 May.
